Guidelines for Presenters

All Presenters

- Choose what you present according to the time and space allocated.
 - You cannot present several years work in one 15 min talk or a single poster
 - Trying to jam too much into your presentation will make a poor presentation
- Graphics
 - All letters, symbols, etc. on posters and lecture slides should be sufficiently large, and not crowded
 - Lecture slides should be readable from the back of the auditorium
 - Posters should be readable from 1.5 m away
 - Bullet points only
 - No complete sentences
 - Only key words
- Don't be a no-show! If you must cancel, notify the program committee.

Poster Presenters

- Poster Purpose – facilitate discussion among interested colleagues
 - Engage visitors in conversation
 - Prepare a 3 min summary of your work and present it to each visitor
 - Use the poster as a backdrop, to explain and illustrate selected points about your work
 - Be at your poster during the poster session, and also for part of coffee breaks

Oral Presenters

- Your time slot (15 minutes for regular oral presentations) includes ~ 1 min for changing over between speakers, and 2-3 minutes for questions and discussion.
 - ∴ net time for presentation is 11 min
 - ~ 11 slides
 - Time and rehearse your presentation
 - The conference will have 0-tolerance for overtime speakers
 - Running overtime is discourteous to other speakers
 - Running overtime is discourteous to the participants
 - Most important session of the conference is the coffee break!
 - At the end of the allotted time, speakers will be cut-off without mercy.
 - No last slide, no summary, or anything overtime.
- Presentations should be in English, to accommodate foreign participants
- Recommend using Power Point to prepare lecture slides
 - Use default formats for good letter size and spacing.
- If you have embedded material (video clips, animations, etc.):
 - These add a lot to the presentation, but often difficulties encountered when using a different computer.
 - *.pps or *.ppsx slide show file format often more successful than *.ppt or *.pptx format.
 - Arrive early and test your presentation on auditorium computer
 - Be prepared to upload supporting files as well as power point file.
 - Have a back-up plan
- Arrive early and upload your presentation to the auditorium computer during registration (or during coffee breaks or lunch for later sessions).
 - Test your presentation on the auditorium computer



- If you must use your own computer, the time required to switch over both before and after your presentation will be subtracted from your allotted time.
 - i.e. figure on a 10 min net lecture time
- Avoid slides having only equations
 - They are boring, and cannot be absorbed in real time
- Avoid slides having multiple graphs or pictures
 - Usually they are illegible, and contain too much material to be absorbed in real time
- Avoid slides having pictures of published papers
 - They contain no scientific information, and cast a bad impression of self-advertising.
- No reference citations in lecture
 - Can't be absorbed in real time
- Emphasize the main points, and avoid details
 - Details cannot be absorbed in real time
